

Helping Aledo's Kids

Nearly one million dollars raised by Aledo AdvoCats since 2002

In 2002, former Aledo Middle School teacher, Katie Alexander, asked two friends to lunch. She wanted to discuss the idea of forming a woman-run volunteer organization to support children in need within their Aledo ISD community. At the time, East Parker County did not have a place for families to go for help with medical and dental needs, food, clothing, school supplies or basic living expenses. She tasked each one to invite seven other friends to

help. These 21 women became the founding members and started the 501(c)(3) non-profit organization called Aledo Children's AdvoCats. The mission is to raise charitable funds to help Aledo ISD children and their families in need.

Through a collaborative effort between the school counselors and AdvoCats, students' needs are identified and met. Sixteen years later, AdvoCats has raised more than \$900,000.

There are three areas to the organization, and each one works directly with each of the ten campus

school counselors to identify qualified students and families.

Children's Fund is the main outreach service. The CF evaluates the needs of each student on an individual basis, and all information is confidential. CF helps with the needs mentioned above, in addition to professional counseling, school-related expenses and other crisis interventions.

The Clothes Closet is a clothing resource for qualified Aledo ISD families, and they are able to shop and receive clothing free of charge. It is also open to the public as a resale store, and proceeds go back to AdvoCats. In 2017, more than 450 students and their families were served, Kristin Brvan, AdvoCats VP of Communications and Clothes Closet volunteer, shared that one mother said, "Thank you for helping Aledo kids. It means so much when your child is no longer embarrassed to attend school because she now has nice shoes and clothes to wear."

Angel Project organizes Christmas gifts for qualified students and siblings residing in the same home. The children's wish lists are assigned to community volunteer shoppers. AdvoCats then collects the gifts and distributes them to the families. In 2017, AdvoCats helped 434 children, representing 174 families. Many families are in tears when they pick up their children's gifts and witness the generosity of our community.

AdvoCats has extended their help over the years with projects such as Bearcat Park, Hancock House of Hope, The East Parker County Library, Shattered Dreams, scholarships for qualified seniors, and Parker County Teen Court, which was co-founded by Judge Lynn Johnson, Aledo Children's AdvoCats Parliamentarian.

"This community has always given outstanding support to our organization," said Ann Simmons, AdvoCats recording secretary and charter member. AdvoCats receives help through its donations, volunteerism and membership. They also sponsor two annual fundraisers: The Help & Hope Luncheon and The Run, Walk or Crawl fun-run.


It wouldn't be a Texas festival without some authentic barbeque
